Late last year two well known local artists contacted us with a view to doing portraits of Veterans. All members were emailed with a view to getting volunteers. Phill and Norm were the first to put their hands and progress is demonstrated by these photos:

As part of the 50th Commemorative Dinner proposals the idea of having an exhibition of portraits of veteran members was floated. This has now developed into a firm proposal and the portraits will be displayed in the "breakout" area on the 1st floor of the Mittagong RSL during the week leading up to the dinner. We also propose to use the display cabinets in this area to exhibit Vietnam memorabilia.



The artists are keen to get to know us, and our Vietnam stories, so that they can put the

portraits in context - probably with quotes about our service, memorabilia or photographs from Vietnam.

"Sitting" for the portraits involves getting to know the artists so that they can get to know you and what you did in Vietnam. Each session lasts about 2 hours, includes coffee and a snack, is enjoyable and rewarding. You will need to commit to between 3 and five sittings.

# **VENUE SELECTION POLICY**

Criteria - Reasonable price, open bar, able to pay individually, distance, ability to seat 30 to 40 diners comfortably, heating in winter.

Berrima, Sutton Forrest and Burrawang are considered as distant locations so only one venue from one village is to be scheduled per year.

Publish the full list of venues for the year and let individuals decide those they wish to attend, as it is accepted that you cannot satisfy all the people all the time.

Alternate drop menus are acceptable.

In recognition of member's busy schedules in December due to family and other commitments, a Christmas in July function is to be planned and a normal Wednesday dinner planned in December. The Christmas in July function is to alternate between Dormie House and the Mittagong RSL.

Dinner times - arrive at 1800 for 1830 meal.

Dinner dates - nothing in January, then the first Wednesday on each following month.
