

ANZAC Day is here again and most of our military forces have been withdrawn from Afghanistan but of course many still remain posted throughout the world. ANZAC Day provides us with a uniquely Australian opportunity to honour: those that have been killed or injured in the service of our nation; comrades; family members and friends; and those that we have not known. It provides a time to reflect on their sacrifice, and the debt we owe for that sacrifice. Their legacy is a free and proud Australia that pursues the cause of freedom throughout the world.

Each year we rotate between the Highlands Towns so that we can march behind our banner and to ensure that we are well represented. This year we will be marching behind our banner at Moss Vale.

The parade will form up at Moss Vale Queens Street Carpark to **step off at 10:40 am** and march to the Cenotaph at the Services Club. The march will be led by the 1/21 Royal NSW Lancers and will march to the tmusic of the Southern Highlands Concert Band and the Hawkesbury/Nepean Valley Pipe Band.

The ANZAC Day service will commence at 11:00 am.

After the service we will adjourn to the Moss Vale **Golf Club**, which is about a kilometer away, to have a few drinks before lunch. The Club's Dining area will be available to us and Lunch will be from the bistro menu and paid for individually. The menu offers a wide range of meals at reasonable prices.

We encourage members to bring their families along to watch the march, participate in the service and join us for lunch. The Golf Club is a great place, in a serene setting with vistas over the verdant golf course.

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

The general tone of the reports is that all is well, our membership continues to grow steadily and stands at 58. Our finances are in good order and our functions are well attended. The various activities we undertake are also proceeding smoothly.

Last year we made a submission to Wingecarribee Shire Council seeking approval in principle for the creation of a Post-World War II Memorial Precinct in Settlers' Park, Bowral.

The proposal includes separate memorials commemorating service in Korea, Malaya-Borneo, the Middle East and Peacekeeping operations. Council has agreed in principle to our proposal subject to us providing detailed designs and costs.

As the Committee felt that the view of the general membership should be gauged, Phill Moscatt spoke to a slide-show presentation outlining the proposals. Phill, Norm and Ray answered questions.

A show of hands at our Annual General Meeting in March indicated general support for further development of the proposal (11 for and 9 against) but this will need to be considered at our next Committee Meeting in April.

SENIORS HEALTH CARD

If you have qualifying war service and do not get a service pension, age pension etc. you may be eligible if you have a <u>taxable</u> income of less than \$80,000.

If an application is successful there are a number of benefits including:

- *A quarterly payment of a seniors supplement
- *Pharmaceuticals at concession rates
- *A considerable Reduction of the PBS Safety net
- *A coniserable reduction in the Medicare Safety Net
- * Bulk Billing
- *Concession fares on The Indian Pacific, The Gahan and the Overland.
