SHVVPPA COMMITTEE MEETINGS



WHATEVER HAPPENED TO THE ARMY LANDROVER?



The Army is presently taking delivery of 1100 *Hawkei* Protected Mobility Vehicles to replace some of its Landrover fleet of vehicles. Delivery is presently underway from Thales Australia's production line in Bendigo. The Hawkei weighs 6.8 t and can carry a payload of 3 t. It provides high levels of protection against land mines, improvised explosive devices and ballistic weapons while being light enough to be air transported by military helicopters.
