
AUSTRALIAN DEFENCE VETRANS' COVENANT

According to DVA - The Australian Defence Veterans' Covenant serves to recognise and acknowledge the unique nature of military service and the contribution of veterans and their families. The Covenant is supported by the Veteran Card, Lapel Pin and Oath. These provide the opportunity for Australians to identify veterans when they are not in uniform or wearing their medals, and offer respect to them and their family.

This initiative is now being rolled out by DVA with one new and important difference: any person who has served in the Defence Forces including Reserves and the CMF, is entitled to the Veteran Card.







All of our members should have a DVA health card but if you do not you will need to apply for the Veteran Card, and the Lapel Pin and Oath – which will be mailed to you. You can do this through a My Gov online account or by ringing DVA 1800 550 457 and saying "Veterans Card" to the automated system – good luck.

If you already have a DVA health card there is no need to apply unless you want to get the Lapel Pin and Oath. The new Veteran Card will be sent to you and will replace your white or gold card. For further details: https://recognition.dva.gov.au/veteran-card

In conjunction with the Covenant card members can join the Australian Partners of Defence (APOD) which is a discount marketing venture set up by Veterans for Veterans and their families. At first glance this seems to be similar to other discounting schemes whereby business offer discounted services.

BOOK PROJECT

Vietnam War Memorial and Cherry Tree Walk

Work on the history of the Vietnam War Memorial and Cherry Tree Walk has progressed steadily. As a preliminary step for writing the history of the memorial, using a grant from the Veolia Mulwaree Trust, we have commissioned the Berrima District Historical & Family Society to review the historical documents of the now defunct Vietnam War Memorial and Cherry Tree Trust, with a view to preparing a Timeline.

We have accessed Wingecarribee Shire Council's records in relation to formation of the Trust and the development and final approval of the overall project. The Bowral Rotary Club is also combing its records for details.

History of the Sub-Branch

As the first step towards compiling a history of our Sub-Branch we are also consolidating electronic copies of Meeting Minutes and Newsletters.

Bowral High School Project

The oral history project is proceeding at a pace this term. To date five interviews sessions have been videoed and the sessions will continue weekly until the end of term. Those interviewed so far are: Phill Moscatt, Tony Blake, John Stead, Ken Burt, John McDonnell, Norm and Sue Austin with Lee Bourgeois, Ray Kuschert, Graham Moffatt and Rick Morse in the pipeline.

The student interviewers, although nervous, quickly settle down and interview participants based on pre-prepared questions, which have been very thoughtful and provoking. History Teacher, Geoff Andrew, is editing the videos and we are looking forward to seeing the results.
